


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



ENGLISH CLASS POLICIES

Times

- Termly classes run according to the New South Wales (Australia) school terms.
- Class times are fixed and agreed upon before the commencement of each term.
- Each term consists of ten lessons.
- Each lesson is 2 hours long.
- Students will be given a 5-minute break midway through the lesson.

Teacher

- The class teacher will be arranged before the commencement of the term to teach all ten lessons. However, Brocklehurst Academy may use a different teacher in rare circumstances (for example, if the original teacher is ill).

Lesson Format

- Lessons are **hybrid**: they will be conducted **in-person at our centre in Burwood** AND via **Zoom** and **Google docs**.
- Each student will receive their individual printed booklet or Google doc with all learning materials prior to the start of each lesson.
- If students are attending online, students are required to have their camera working throughout the lesson. This is to ensure they are participating in the lesson.
- Online students must use the 'hand up' function for permission to speak in the lesson. Interruptions are not permitted.
- Lessons will be automatically recorded so that they can be sent to any absent students (see below).
- Video recordings of lessons will be deleted after thirty days.

ENGLISH CLASS POLICIES

Homework

- Homework is set at the end of each lesson. Homework tasks will ordinarily require 30 minutes to 1 hour to complete.
- Homework must be completed in the student's Google doc, which the teacher can access. Homework should not be emailed to the teacher.
- Homework must be completed 48 hours prior to the next lesson to allow time for the teacher to properly mark it and provide detailed feedback.
- Students should pay careful attention to the feedback and act upon any advice given.

Equipment

Students attending online will need the following:

- A laptop or tablet that can use the software detailed below.
- A working Zoom account.
- A Gmail address so that they can use Google docs during the lessons and for homework tasks.
- If in China, a working VPN so that they can use Google docs.

Absences

- You cannot reschedule or cancel a lesson. If absent, the student will be sent a video recording (mp4) and be expected to complete the classwork and homework for that lesson.
- The teacher will provide feedback for homework as normal.

THE SCHOLAR'S PROGRAMME

We also offer a programme for years 7–9 that combines one-to-one weekly tuition and the weekly class outlined above: the **Scholar's Programme**.

What's included:

-  **Weekly online class (2 hours)** with expert instruction, carefully-crafted learning resources, and homework feedback.
-  **Weekly private tuition (1 hour) with a Platinum Tutor** tailored to the student's needs — whether it's building on the class content or supporting schoolwork and assessment tasks.

That's **3 hours of live teaching each week, plus targeted feedback** — ideal for ambitious students seeking steady growth, confidence, and high achievement.

4 PRICING & PAYMENT

Private tuition

For private tuition, see page 6 for pricing.

Students are expected to attend weekly sessions with their private tutor during term time. If you cannot attend a session, you must arrange an alternative time with your tutor in that same week.

Prepay

As of 2026, we **only accept prepaid bulk payments**:

- Families prepay for 10 private lessons at a time before the commencement of a school term.
- Lessons may be 1 hour, 1.5 hours, or 2 hours.
- The agreed weekly time is reserved exclusively for you. This system ensures consistency, fairness, and availability for all students.

Rescheduling and Cancellations

We understand that occasionally lessons need to be changed.

- At least 24 hours' notice is required to cancel or reschedule a lesson.
- If you cannot reschedule a cancelled lesson with valid notice, a lesson credit is created.
- Credits:
 - Are not refunded as cash.
 - Can be used to reduce the next term's payment.
 - A **maximum of two credits** may be carried forward.
- Lessons cancelled without 24 hours' notice are charged in full, as the time has already been reserved.

PRICING & PAYMENT

English Classes

For English group classes, in person or online, **each lesson is \$110** (\$55 per hour)

Only the **Prepay** option is available for online classes. Bulk payment for 10 lessons (**\$1,100**) is due before the first lesson of the term.

If a student misses a lesson, **the missed lesson cannot be used as a credit for future lessons**. Students will be emailed a video recording of the lesson (see page 9) and will be expected to complete all work and homework for marking.

Trial Option for New Students

For English group classes, new students can opt for **introductory trial lessons**. This option allows you to pay for only **2 lessons (\$220)**, after which you do not have to continue with the class. Payments must be received before the first lesson.

Scholar's Programme

For the Scholar's Programme, each week is **\$210** — that's for both the 2-hour weekly class and 1-hour weekly private session with a Platinum tutor (see page 11).

Only the **Prepay** option is available for the Scholar's Programme. Bulk payment for 10 weeks (**\$2,100**) is due before the first lesson of the term.

New students can opt for the **trial option**: you pay for only **2 weeks (\$420)**, after which you do not have to continue with the programme. Payments must be received before the first lesson.

MAKING PAYMENT

All lesson records, invoices and payment receipts are stored in your **Tutorbird** account.

We accept payment via **bank transfer** or **debit/credit card** for all three options (private, group classes, Scholar's Programme).

Bank Transfer

You can pay via bank transfer and avoid the debit/credit card transaction fees.

Automatic Payment via debit/credit card

All debit/credit card payments incur a 0.5% transaction fee.

When you sign up for tutoring with us, you can choose to provide your card details in our Portal which will be stored on our secure payment platform. With this billing system, you don't have to worry about making payments — it's 100% automated each term.

All card details are deleted from our system once tutoring has ceased.

5 RESCHEDULING & CANCELLATIONS

Private Tuition

We understand that occasionally lessons need to be changed.

To reschedule or cancel a private session, contact your tutor directly at least **24 hours PRIOR** to the session. If you reschedule or cancel a session with less than 24 hours notice without an acceptable reason, **you will be charged the full cost of the tutoring session.**

Examples of acceptable reasons for timely cancellation or rescheduling:

- Illness; transport issues; holidays; family emergency.

Examples of unacceptable reasons for cancelling weekly lessons:

- “I don’t feel like it.”
- “I just don’t need help with English right now.”

When you sign up for one-on-one tuition, you are agreeing to have **weekly sessions during term time**. This is to ensure that you are making consistent progress. English is a challenging subject that requires regular work.


Lesson Credits

- If you cannot reschedule a cancelled lesson, or your tutor is unavailable for an alternative time, a lesson credit will be issued.
- Credits:
 - Are not refunded as cash.
 - Can be used to reduce the next term's payment.
 - A maximum of two credits may be carried forward.
- Lessons cancelled without 24 hours' notice are charged in full, as the time has already been reserved.

To reschedule a private session, **contact your tutor to arrange another time.**

You can also **log in to the portal via our website**. In the Calendar, you can cancel your session and then book another session from the tutor's available slots.

Be sure that you click on 'Search' and then click 'Show open lesson slots'.

TRIAL LESSONS

TRIAL LESSONS FOR PRIVATE TUITION

For your first private session, you can opt for a trial lesson. After this lesson, there is no commitment to continue tutoring with us.

The trial lesson is not free. It is charged at the normal rate (see page 6).

No discounts are given for a trial lesson for private tuition – unless agreed upon with the director of Brocklehurst Academy.

TRIAL LESSONS FOR YEARS 7–9 GROUP CLASSES

For years 7–9 English group classes, new students can opt for introductory trial lessons. This option allows you to pay for only 2 lessons (\$220), after which you do not have to continue with the class. Payments must be received before the first lesson.

TRIAL LESSONS FOR THE SCHOLAR'S PROGRAMME

For the Scholar's Programme, new students can opt for the trial option: you pay for only 2 weeks (\$420), after which you do not have to continue with the programme. Payments must be received before the first lesson.

FAQS

1. Are there contracts?

No, but once you have paid for 10 weeks of tuition with us, the fee is non-refundable. For private tuition, two lesson credits can be transferred to the following term's payment.

2. Why do you only accept weekly students for private tuition?

Weekly tutoring ensures you get the greatest benefit from our tutors. We believe that casual, irregular sessions don't allow us to provide the level of support or achieve the results our students deserve. We're committed to your success and value working with equally dedicated students!

3. Can we arrange small-group private sessions?

Absolutely. Contact us to discuss availability and price.

4. Can I opt for PAYG (Pay as You Go)?

We no longer offer this option as it took up too much administrative time and effort. We now only accept payment in bulk per term.

5. How do I access resources?

For private tuition and English classes, your tutor will provide you with your own Google Drive folder and place all resources in there. For in-person classes, you will also be given printed resources. You will need a working Gmail account to effectively use these resources (e.g. Google Docs etc).

6. Can I pay by cash?

Unfortunately, no. We only accept credit/debit card and bank transfer. Bank transfer does not incur any transaction costs.

7. Are there transaction fees for debit/credit cards?

Yes, debit/credit cards are charged 0.5% transaction fees. To avoid these, please pay by bank transfer.

8. Can I change tutors?

Should you wish to switch tutors for any reason, we're happy to arrange that for you. Simply reach out to us directly at english@brocklehurstacademy.com.

9. Can I be placed on a waiting list if my desired tutor is not available for private tuition?


Yes, you can. We can place you on a waiting list and we will notify you when there is availability. However, it may take some time (many weeks or months) for a space to become available.

10. What happens if I find that there has been no improvement in a student's school assessments for English?

While we confidently guarantee the highest quality English tuition, we cannot promise instant improvements in school assessment marks. English is a complex and nuanced subject that takes time, practice, and persistence to master. Expecting dramatic results after just a few sessions is unrealistic — and often counterproductive.

We encourage parents and students to view English tutoring as a long-term investment. Steady, meaningful progress happens over time, and there are many factors that can influence school results — including a student having an off day, misreading a question, illness, or even internal school marking practices designed to standardise results for ATAR scaling.
